1. Articulation from Diploma to the Advanced Diploma or Bachelor (Completed Award)

- 1.1. Students may articulate from the Diploma course to the Advanced Diploma course at the completion of the Diploma
- 1.2. Students may articulate from the Diploma course to the Bachelor course at the completion of the Diploma if:
 - 1.2.1. They have achieved an overall course average of 65% or higher or
 - 1.2.2. They have achieved a semester average of 65% or higher in the last semester of study or
 - 1.2.3. They have achieved a Credit average in their last semester and receive approval from the Dean of Academics and Research.

2. Credit for Diploma Studies

- 2.1. Students who articulate at the completion of Diploma studies will receive 24 credit points towards either their Advanced Diploma or their Bachelor award.

3. Articulation from Advanced Diploma to Bachelor (Completed Award)

- 3.1. Students may articulate from the Advanced Diploma course to the Bachelor course at the completion of the Advanced Diploma if:

- 3.1.1. They have achieved an overall course average of 60% or higher
or
 - 3.1.2. They have achieved a semester average of 65% or higher in the last semester of study or
 - 3.1.3. They have achieved a Credit average in their last semester and receive approval from the Dean of Academics and Research.
- 4. Articulation from Advanced Diploma to Bachelor (non-completed Award)**
- 4.1. Students may articulate from the Advanced Diploma course to the Bachelor course prior to completing the Advanced Diploma if:
 - 4.1.1. They have achieved a semester average of 65% or higher in the last semester of study or
 - 4.1.2. They have achieved a Credit average in their last semester and receive approval from the Dean of Academics and Research.
- 5. Credit for Advanced Diploma Studies**
- 5.1. Students who articulate either at the completion of, or during their Advanced Diploma studies will receive 2 credit points for every 3 credit points completed.
- 6. Requirements for Completion**
- 6.1. Students who articulate either at the completion of, or during their Advanced Diploma studies will be required to complete a minimum of 8 units at the Bachelor Level, with no less than 6 at a 700 level.
 - 6.2. Students will be required to complete any core units not completed at an Advanced Diploma Level.
 - 6.3. The College will notify students during their enrolment appointment of any other required units to be completed.
- 7. Articulation from Bachelor to MTH (Completed Award)**
- 7.1. Students may articulate from the Bachelor course to the Sydney College of Divinity Master of Theology course at the completion of the Bachelor of Ministry.
 - 7.2. Students will be required to complete a new application to apply for entry into the Sydney College of Divinity award.
 - 7.3. No credit is provided for the Bachelor of Ministry towards the Master of Theology.

8. Articulation from Graduate Diploma to Sydney College of Divinity (Completed or Non-completed Award)

- 8.1. Students may articulate from the Graduate Diploma course to the Sydney College of Divinity higher level awards.
- 8.2. Students will be required to complete a new application to apply for entry into the Sydney College of Divinity award.
- 8.3. Students will receive credit for their completed units towards either the Graduate Diploma of Ministry, Master of Arts, Master of Divinity awards as determined by the policies of Sydney College of Divinity.
